Project Overview

Tell us a little about your project. What are the main objectives of the project, and who will benefit from it?

By Investing in Water and Sanitation systems in schools, Rotary brings clean water, sanitation and hygiene services directly to children reducing their exposure to water borne diseases. All researches show that wash in schools programme reduces school dropout rates particularly for Girls, increase community adoption of Wash practices, children become change agents in the communities, prevent the spread of diseases and reduce nutrition deficiencies. The objective of this Global Grant is to Provide Wash Facilities so as to bring about behavioral change in children, teachers and also parents. The task at hand becomes more significant when the schools have been chosen which cater to the needs of children of such families who are below the poverty line. Even at their homes many of them do not have proper sanitation facilities. By providing them these facilities and necessary training, the children become instrumental in taking this message of sanitation to their parents and to their communities. To a great extent this brings about the restoration of self respect among them who are in fact the future of this country.

WinS shall be implemented in these 100 schools by Rotary Club Jaipur Mid Town, who together have already surveyed and analyzed the requirement of each school. Detailed charts of 100 school each are attached herewith.

At Our District Level we have already signed an agreement (MOU) with the Government of Rajasthan, to work for our Wash In School Project in more than 500 school of different areas, and these 100 schools are part out of those already selected 500 Schools. Government would allow us to work in these schools. In fact they have already issued directions to assist Rotary for the development of these selected schools

The main beneficiaries of this project would be the children of under privileged families and through them their communities. If we take an average of 200 children in school, it would directly benefit 20000

Children(In charts the exact No of students are given which is approx 20965) and indirectly more than 40000 persons, if we take only their parents into consideration. It is a unique way to develop children to effectively become agents of change

Now our countries Prime Minister has also taken a move of having Toilets in every home. We would form a committee of rotarians which would look after the proper implementation with the above organization (Mayur). They would also look after the training part of students/teachers to proper use of these facilities. They will also help in forming school committee(Bal Sansad) which would look after other day to day improvement. Rotarians will also undertake them selves and with the help of some professionals the training part for behavioral

change amongst students/teachers/staff.

Project planning

Describe the community needs that your project will address.

The project will address the low level of awareness on hand wash and hygiene and also the inadequate hand wash and toilet facilities available in schools of rural area.

We understand from our survey that in Rajasthan there are more than 13,000 schools and out of which around 60% schools do not have gender segregated toilets, 90% do not have group hand washing stations, also 90% do not have MHM system, and this is a matter of serious concern.

Most of the Govt schools are in rural village area and these 100 schools are located in the remote area, where no basic facility is there, due to which the child education is very much affected, even the Govt is giving free education. Parents are not sending their childrens to school specially the Girl childrens, being no proper toilet/sanitation facility. After a certain age the girls are forced to remain at home and at the end the community remains illiterate. With this project Rotary is providing them a positive approach to attend the

school. As already mentioned that Rotary in our district has signed a MOU with the Govt to provide these facilities in 500 selected schools, and these 100 schools are out of these selected schools.

How did your project team identify these needs?

As mentioned that Rotary leadership in our district has a number of rounds of discussions with the senior Govt officials how to improve the situation of Govt schools where the children can get a better atmosphere to learn, and we the rotarians with Govt officials made a survey and selected these schools where these basic facilities are badly needed. Sr district officers discussed the project with our club and our PP Suresh Poddar has agreed to assist the project financially as well as implementation coordination through his company mayur Uniquoters Limited.

How were members of the benefiting community involved in finding solutions?

The most benefiting persons would be Children of the school/village and also the parents of these children. The children are very happy when they came to know about the rotary project. In fact Rotary has already become a brand to implement the work beneficial for the large public. The school administration helped us in our survey and helped how we can provide the facility in minimum expenditure.

How were community members involved in planning the project?

As mentioned we took help of local school staff/ Headmasters/ surpanch/elected representative to ascertain the need of each & every school, since they have got all the information about the requirement. We planned in consultation with them. We have meetings with village leadership to plan and how to implement the project in the best way.

We have a target of complete literacy in South Asia and so on for India also. By providing these facilities we would improve the education standards of these children and with their improved education they would better think for their employment and would be in a position to earn the bread & butter for the family and many children after attaining a major age would get proper job, so with this project we would make our next generation "Self employed"

The project also align with Programmes of the Government, including Anganwadi Centers and Gram Panchayats to spread awareness on Proper Hand wash, Hygiene and Zero open defecation and MHM.

Please describe the training, community outreach, or educational programs this project will include.

As mentioned above we would have proper training of students and teachers as well as for their parents also. These training programmes would be organized on quarterly basis as per the norms set by WHO and by Health Officials and our rotary volunteers. Govt. of Rajasthan will be a partner in implementations of the

training of all categories. UNICEF has been helping Rotary in designing proper curriculum for such training. We shall also employ professionals for training for which provision has been made in the Global Grant Application.

Beside above we have one professional trainer also in house, who is ready to give his training to all the teacher/students voluntarily. He is Mr. Mukesh Singh, he is Master in Social Work,. Regarding him we want to mention that "Having professional proficiency in designing of Program, Execution & Capacity Building and monitoring & Evaluation with strong analytical skill. He has trained more than 2800 students and school teachers on Sanitation, Hand wash practices, Personal Hygiene in last 10 years.

How were these needs identified?

First we create an environment in school where each child will be able to understand the importance of good health and Hygiene. We will provide training and other material to students and teachers related to good health and hygiene practices. Also provide the facilities of Group Hand wash, well maintained toilets. Teachers and our volunteers shall monitor the use of provided resources.

What incentives (for example, monetary compensation, awards, certification, or publicity), will you use, if any, to encourage community members to participate in the project?

Yes, We will recognize the students/teachers by honoring them at school/gram level who will work to create more awareness about the programme.

These activities of training etc will be regularly look after by the student/teacher team of the school. The maintenance part will also be monitored by a team of students and teachers and staff of the school.
